Eligibility: Open to all USBC-Certified youth, twelve years old and up (based on August 1, 2011). Pre-registration is encouraged, contact Jeff Fleck via email for registration. Registration fee of $\$ 30.00$ is due prior to competition for the Jr. Gold card good through July 2013. This is a SPORT-JR. GOLD certified league. Participants that will age out prior to 2013 will only pay a $\$ 10.00$ Sport card upgrade, if not a sport card holder. ALL bowlers are required to pay Ohio and Dayton USBC dues to participate in this league.

Schedule: $\quad$ The league will bowl on Wednesdays at 7:00 pm (check-in time $6: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ ) for 12 weeks beginning May $2^{\text {nd }}$ and concluding on July 25, 2012. The entire house schedule is posted on front side of flyer.

Sport Compliant: The league will participate on USBC Sport CERTIFIED conditions. Each pattern will be scheduled in advance to allow athletes to research each pattern prior to competition. This league will pay for the sport card UPGRADE for each participant (registration fee).

Dress Code: The shirt provided is intended for competition each week. Shorts and jeans are permitted for this league, hats/head covers are not permitted. League management will determine if any attire is deemed inappropriate.

Format/Scoring: This is a singles tournament-format league. Each week, all bowlers will bowl a three (3) game qualifying round. The top 16 bowlers (based on 32 or more entries), will advance to a bracketed, single game elimination rounds "tournament" until a weekly champion is determined. Minimum of two females will advance to the round of 16 .

Cost: The cost per bowler per week is $\$ 18.00$. Breakdown: $\$ 10.00$ lineage, $\mathbf{\$ 7 . 0 0}$ for awards and $\$ 1.00$ to Wright State Collegiate Bowling in lieu of secretary fees.

Averages: Bowlers will use an entering average for the first nine (9) games. This average will be the bowler's WSU Traveling league final average from last season with a minimum of fifteen (15) games. If the bowler does not have a WSU Traveling League average from last season, he/she will use the highest sport average from another league including collegiate bowling from the 2011-12 season with a minimum of 15 games. If neither of these, then the bowler will use highest book average with a minimum of 21 games from the 2011-12 season adjusted to sport average.

Handicap: Handicap will be based on $80 \%$ of 200. Maximum handicap per bowler per game: 32 pins (160 average).
Attendance: There is no pre-bowling or post-bowling. Substitutes are allowed to bowl for a regular for only two (2) weeks and will also use an entering average based on the rule above. A minimum of (7) weeks participation is required to be eligible to compete in the championship round. Those with less than 7 weeks and at least 4 weeks can compete in the consolation bracket. Substitutes are not permitted to compete in the final week (Championship or Consolation).

Points: Every bowler will earn points each of the eleven (11) weeks in which the bowler participates. Points will not be earned at the end-of-season Championship Tournament (week 12). Points will be earned each week based on the following formula:

Bowlers will earn one (1) point for every bowler who finishes below him/her in the Qualifying Round. Points based on placement and performance are earned every week that you bowl. The more weeks you bowl, the more points you earn. End of season 1, 2 \& 3 place point leaders will receive awards.

Championship: This league will conduct an end of season championship Tournament July 25, 2012 in which all bowlers who bowled in this league no fewer than (7) weeks may participate. Format: The end-of-season Championship Tournament will consist of a three (3) game qualifying round which will advance the top 18 bowlers along with each week's champion (11), plus the top (3) point leaders, total 32 . If any of these bowlers qualified twice during the league, the vacancies will be filled from the qualifying field. The Championship bracket will be single game elimination format.

Awards: SMART money scholarship based on number of players (paid \$5,592 summer 2011). End of season awards for $1^{\text {st }}$, $\overline{2^{\text {nd }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}}$ place point leaders, High average / game / series both boy \& girl (HDCP \& SCRATCH) and all tournament qualifiers. League point leaders for boys and girls will each receive a Jr. Gold entry along with tournament champion, if they decline the spot it will go to the next person in line according to category. Bowlers must bowl at least 4 regular weeks to receive SMART money.

Compliance: In the event of a dispute not specifically covered by our league rules, bowlers agree, by their voluntary participation in the league, the authority of league management will adjudicate all disputes, (subject to USBC rules) and what is deemed to be in the best interest of this league. Ty Davidson and Jeff Fleck (Wright State University Head Coaches) are the tournament directors/ management of this league.
